RIMEF Awards \$115,324 in PRIME Grants



Students in the Rock Island-Milan School District will benefit from 52 PRIME (Promoting Rock Island Milan Education) Grants awarded on July 31 at the RIHS Auditorium. The \$115,324 from the Rock Island-Milan Education Foundation will fund projects throughout the district in classrooms from Horace Mann Early Learning Center to Rock Island High School. 28 Teacher, 20 Departmental/School, and 4 Multi-School grants were funded and these will provide programs, materials, and technologies for 2019-2020 school year.

This year, 3rd Graders from Ms. Arkebauer's class at Eugene Field will explore STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) experiences. Ms. Stribling's Basic Nursing students at Rocky will be better prepared for working with elderly patients with the help of a Geriatric Sensory Impairment kit. Washington Junior High students will develop positive mindsets and problem-solving skills this year thanks to a PRIME Grant secured by Ms. Tingley. 49 other creative projects taught by 60 other dedicated, inspired teachers will help our students grow and attain their academic goals.

PRIME Grants provide financial resources for materials, technologies, and innovative programs that would otherwise go unfunded. Teachers submit applications in June stating overviews, costs and a summary of how the programs or requested materials will enhance, expand, and/or improve the academic environment. Teachers may apply for grants up to \$1,500, Departmental/School grants are available for up to \$3,000, and Multi-school grants can be as high as \$5,000.

The Rock Island-Milan Education Foundation's PRIME Grant program can only continue through the generosity of donors, and our business /community partners. Additional funds are provided by Junior Board of the Quad Cities, the Doris and Victor Day Foundation, and the Rauch Family Foundation. Our Major Saver fundraiser is a large resource for our PRIME funding as well as providing direct funds to our schools. For the 2nd year, Edwards Creative in Milan donated the award plaques for all our teachers to proudly display in their classrooms. We thank all those who support this vital program.




