Austin Academic Achievement Awards and Scholarships 2025!

The Austin Academic Achievement Awards and RIMEF Scholarship Night celebrates academic excellence at Rock Island High School. On May 14th, 128 students were recognized and rewarded in front of a packed audience of parents/caretakers, families, RIHS faculty/administration, RIMSD board members, RIMEF board/committee members, and alumni in the RIHS Auditorium. 70 Top Ten students were recognized for their academic success and 68 deserving seniors of the Class of 2025 were awarded a record total of \$180,700 in scholarship awards to help them further their education. Funded by RIMEF contributors, the 1st and 2nd place Austin Academic Achievement Award scholarships were given out by teachers representing each of the 10 academic areas. Numerous scholarship benefactors attended the awards night, and many were able to present their award on stage. The very special evening concluded with a reception in front of the RIMEF Office within Rock Island High School. It was a night to celebrate!



The entire evening's celebration and the awards for our outstanding RIHS students were made possible by the generosity of our AAAA contributors and 52 scholarship benefactors. This tradition recognizing and awarding academic excellence at Rock Island High School will continue thanks to the strong community support of the students, teachers, and schools of the Rock Island-Milan School District.

2024-2025 Final Pitch!

Five teams from the '24-'25 RIHS INCubator.edu class presented their business pitches on May 21 in the Rocky Auditorium. The teams advanced from the Academic Pitch held on May 7. Both pitches were scored by a panel of judges from the academic and business communities. The five presenting teams were: A Whistle Away, Bracey, Downhill, Foodies, ReGear, and XLIFT. A Whistle Away was named "Best Business Model" and "Best Business Potential" and received the \$5,000 award. ReGear was named "Best Pitch" and received a \$3,000 award. Both teams can use their prize money as seed funds for their businesses, or the team members may evenly divide their winnings for scholarship awards.



RIMEF FUNDS DISTRICT PROGRAMS

Reading Revolution: Visting Author Series

In partnership with the RIMSD Dept. of Teaching & Learning and The Midwest Writing Center, the RIMEF provided 400 copies of the book The Family Tree to 2nd grade students throughout the district. Sheila Moore Guy, the local author, was invited to give presentations of the book to the students and their teachers.

The book follows two brothers who escaped slavery to fight in the Civil War and were eventually stationed at the Rock Island Arsenal. After the war they settled in Rock Island. A study guide with the book helped the teachers guide the text to real world connections for the students.

> The author's presentations and the book are part of the district's "Reading Revolution" initiative. The Family Tree meets Illinois ELA State Reading Standards and supplements the district curriculum.

Figge Big Picture Outreach Program

The RIMEF partnered with the Figge Art Museum to fund their Big Picture Immersive Outreach Program at Rock Island High School. This program positively impacts at-risk students at RIHS to help increase attendance and strengthen the students' educational experiences. The program includes four social life skills classes, provides resources and art materials to social workers counseling students, and serves one special needs class.

A designated space where social workers, counselors, art therapists, and a Community Engagement Coordinator from the Figge provides a safe space and an environment for art to bring a positive energy.

The results are improved student Success at regulating emotions, gaining confidence, & attending class more regularly.



Seal of Biliteracy Program

17 RIHS Seniors earned the Seal of Biliteracy, and 9 Seniors received a Commendation Towards Biliteracy in the 2024-2025 school year. Recognizing students' proficiency in English and other languages, the Seal of Biliteracy Program encourages language learning and acknowledges the valuable skill of knowing multiple languages in today's diverse society. To earn the Seal of Biliteracy, students must:

- Meet English proficiency requirements passing state assessments or meeting district standards
- Show proficiency in a second language passing an approved language proficiency exam, completing advanced language coursework, or demonstrating equivalent skills

The honor appears on both the student's diploma and transcript highlighting their bilingual skills to both colleges and employers. The Seal of Biliteracy signals a student's readiness to engage in a multilingual world and supports academic/career opportunities.
